

July 19, 2017

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town office. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. All members were present. The meeting was officially noticed June 17th & 18th, 2017.

Heeg made a motion to approve the minutes for July 5th, 2017 Board of Review and regular meeting. Frank seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Rick from REGI spoke to the Plan Commission. He said that they are willing to help the Town out. They would suggest around \$4500 a year for their service. They are currently working with the City of Nekoosa to create a strategic plan. The Town will look at joining around budget time.

Frank made a motion to approve the operator's licenses for Stephanie Schmid. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Forbes made a motion to approve the concrete waiver for a driveway for Darryl and Joyce Clauson, 830 Ranger Road. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. The paperwork will be filed with the Wood County Register of Deeds.

Dave Ryun gave the Constable report. The Town is still waiting for the signed conditional use agreement with Dave Ramsden regarding Stocor.

4 tickets have been issued to a person on Broadway for dogs running loose. The dog is not mean so the humane officer has not been contacted. Each time the neighbor calls the Constable when they are loose, he will continue to issue tickets.

There are 8 Five day tickets for non re-registration of a dog license still remaining. 2 of the people that received the tickets have moved from the area. The remaining 6 will go forward with prosecution.

Scott Brehm with Stealth Solutions reviewed the clean-up of both of Ken Jaecks properties in the Town. 157 Tires were removed along with 14 vehicles and vehicle metal. A bill will be sent to Ken Jaecks for the abatement of his properties.

Billie-Jo Kester gave the Treasurer report. August 2nd will be the audit of Town books.

Passineau thanked Bruce Dimick and Phil Coates for the sand to fill in the dips that are being fixed within the Town. 15 of the worst dips in the town either have been or will be fixed this year. Ten Mile Avenue will have gravel placed on it for a few weeks before it is pulverized and an overlay of asphalt is done.

Correspondences were read.

Forbes made a motion to approve the bills paid. Heeg seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Frank made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
