Plum Creek cut the trees before checking with the Town about the limits, which were put on because the road is in bad shape. The Town has not heard from Plum Creek or the logging company about getting the wood off the property.

There are many signs that are being stolen in the Town. The Town has to replace them. The cost of each sign is anywhere from \$28 to \$40 each.
