

June 3, 2015

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town office. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. All members were present. The meeting was officially noticed.

Heeg made a motion to approve the May 20th, 2015 meeting minutes. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed.

Christine Zurfluh, 8311 St Hwy 13 South, stated that someone shot thru a window in her house and one of her neighbors had two bullets through their house. She would like the Town to enact an ordinance preventing people from shooting so close to houses. According to State Statute, a person can shoot on their own property as close as they want to their own house, but on property that is not theirs, they have to be at least 100 yards from a building. The board suggest she also contact the DNR to check their rules.

Brad and Pat Pavloski would like to dredge a small section of NEPCO Lake and Four Mile Creek. The DNR and Army Corp of Engineers are doing soil samples. The DNR would decide where the sediment would go on land. The Pavloski's are meeting with Domtar since they are very concerned with the water quality also. Passineau made a motion to approve Resolution 6-3-2015; Supporting the Dredging of and Restoration of Navigability to NEPCO Lake and Four Mile Creek. Frank seconded it. Motion passed.

Laura Delaney and Nathan Christie discussed getting wood off Plum Creek property. They would need to travel Ten Mile Avenue to get to Highway 13. Ten Mile Avenue is posted 6 tons for one axel and 10 tons for two axels, since the road is not in the best shape. It is the only posted road in the Town. They would like to do a bond of \$5,000. The Board would like them to do a bond in the amount of \$60,000 in case there was damage done to the road. It would cost at least that much to fix the road. The Board does not want the tax payers to have to pay for fixing the road if they caused damage. Forbes made a motion to deny the request. There was lack of a second. The motion failed. They need to get the wood off the property within two week of cutting. It has been about two weeks already, so they really need to get the wood off the property and to the mill. The Board questioned them about running partial loads to stay within the road's posted limits. That is not economical for them. There is no other road they can use to get the wood out. The Board asked about having a Letter of Credit instead of a bond. They said that would be about the same as the bond, and would cost them money to get. They didn't know what the price difference between a \$5,000 and \$60,000 bond. Forbes made a motion to deny the request. They must either get a bond of \$60,000 or run partial loads on the road. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed.

A letter was sent to KAW Furniture along with a copy of the Closing-Out Sales Ordinance. They must pay a fee to the Town for the Sale. The Town has heard no response.
