

October 18, 2017

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town office. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. All members were present. The meeting was officially noticed October 16, 2017.

Heeg made a motion to approve the minutes for October 4 and 11, 2017 meetings. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Bill from Mobile Lock and Security gave the Town a bid for a camera system for \$965. It would be a system with 2 cameras. The system has a 5 year warranty. If there was a problem with the system, Bill would not charge a service call.

Scott with Stealth Solutions gave the Town a bid for a camera system for \$1200. It would also be a system with 2 cameras. The system has a 10 year warranty. There would be a \$50 service call for problems.

Per Mar gave a bid for \$1288 for a 1 camera system. It would include a 1 year warranty. Mobile Lock also gave a bid that would replace the current panic system within the office at a price of \$240 a year. Currently the Town pays over \$1000 for that service through Per Mar. Passineau made a motion to go with the camera and panic systems through Mobile Lock and Security. Frank seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Forbes made a motion to deny the Certified Survey Map for Great Northern Timber Company. The out lot that they are proposing to split is less than 1 acre which is a requirement in the Town. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Passineau made a motion to approve the operator's licenses for Gabrielle Dodd, Trisha Moody, Jill Tiffany, and Amber Osowski. Heeg seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Dave Ryun gave the Constable report. Court for Harry Barwick just finished today. Barwick was found guilty and must pay a forfeiture of \$350 plus court costs. He has 30 days to clean the property of all junk and unlicensed and un-runnable vehicles. If he does not have the property clean he will be charged a per day fine from today's date.

Dave checked the license plate list that was supplied to the Towns' lawyer by Ken Jaecks. Several of the cars didn't have correct plates. Many of the other cars have temporary plates that will expire in November. Dave will continue to monitor. Ken is now detailing cars at the Saratoga Auto and Detail shop. Dave has sent him a letter and notified him that he does need to get a business license. He will be sent a ticket if he does not obtain the license.

Stratton on Pine Street has defaulted on the nuisance ordinance violation. Dave will send him a second ticket since the property has not been cleaned. If he does not clean his property, the Town will have to start proceedings through the circuit court to have an abatement done and have Stratton be responsible for the clean-up costs.

Tony Berger is putting on the Beers Bikes and Babes facebook page that he is open for business for selling things and consignment and that they are booking private parties at their business at 6421 Hwy 13 South. They have not applied for a business permit through the Town. Dave has sent a letter to Tony informing him that he has to obtain a permit and has not heard anything back. A ticket will be sent to Tony for failure to obtain a business license.

There is a property on County Road Z that has a house and a pole building. Within the pole building a loft and residence was built without a building permit being taken out. Lorelei, the building inspector, was contacted about the property after the work was all completed. According to the Town ordinance, there can only be 1 dwelling on a parcel of land and a parcel of land has to be at least 1 acre to split. The Board told Lorelei to contact the owners to have them come into a board meeting.

Billie-Jo Kester gave the Treasurer report. She is working with Nekoosa-Port Edwards State Bank to finalize the process of tax collection at the bank. She will also be meeting with

Bancroft State Bank to see if they would also help with the tax collection.

Correspondences were read.

Silver Canoe should be getting paved October 19, 2017 after the culvert under the road was lowered. Problems with the dam was making water push up against County Road Z and going under the road so it was affecting the integrity of the road. The dam was going to need to be fixed at a cost of around a million dollars and Domtar did not want to pay to fix it. Wood County Highway Department is doing the work to alleviate the problems along County Road Z. The Town will be applying for a TRIP grant for roadwork to be done on 64<sup>th</sup> Street in 2018. Passineau has also applied for grants for several other miles of roads within the Town through the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Frank made a motion to approve the bills paid. Heeg seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Frank made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Passineau seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
