

March 20, 2019

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 p.m. in the town office. Chairman Rickaby called the meeting to order. Passineau and Heeg were absent. The meeting was officially noticed on March 15th, 2019.

Frank made a motion to approve the minutes for the March 6th, 2019 meeting. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Frank made a motion to amend the minutes for the February 6, 2019 meeting. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Tina Krummel, 2520 Ranger Road, requested to have a Stocor container at her property for 120 days. With the weight of the snow, their shed roof collapsed. They would like to store items in the container while the shed is being repaired. Forbes made a motion to approve the storage container on the property for 120 days. Frank seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Frank made a motion to approve the operator's license for Cassidy McLennan. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

There was no building inspector's report.

Billie-Jo Kester gave the Treasurer's report. Dog licenses are due March 31st. There are still approximately 280 dogs from 2018 that are still un-licensed. The County Clerk said that the Saratoga First Responder's could sell raffle tickets at the Town hall on April 2nd as long as long as they are not in the way of the election process.

There was no Constable's report.

The Plan Commission would like the Board members to review a short-term rental ordinance. They have worked on it for over four months. The ordinance is taken from an ordinance that was challenged by court and upheld in a different part of the state.

Quite a few people used the sand and sand bags that were dropped off by Wood County Emergency Government over the past weekend.

Chairman Rickaby would like to have Kester Road on the next agenda. There is a lot of ice on the road. The Town may have to look at moving the road since it is offset.

The advertising for the transfer site and compost site were discussed. The prices of tires taken at the transfer site will remain the same. The brush site will be open the beginning of April, depending on the amount of snow on the ground, through mid-May.

The Town spent approximately \$1500 on the February primary so far. The Clerk will check if the Town has to pay for the ballot printing and coding that was done through the County.

Frank made a motion to approve the bills paid. Forbes seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Forbes made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Frank seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:17 p.m.
